First Sunday of Christmas

Hellooo friends! It's almost the beginning of a brand new year. Some people begin the new year by making something called a New Year's Resolution. A resolution is like a promise, one that you can make to yourself, like saying that you'll do better at keeping your room clean, or study harder, or read your Bible more....or...maybe even being nicer to your siblings?!

Most people don't do a very good job at keeping resolutions. No big deal, right? I mean, it's just a promise that we make to ourselves, right? NO!!! A promise is a promise!

God is always faithful in keeping God's promises. In our gospel lesson from Luke, we read the story about a man named Simeon. Simeon was a very old man who had faithfully served God all of his life. Simeon was looking forward to meeting the Messiah. God had promised Simeon that he would not die until he had seen the Christ, the promised One. A few days after Jesus was born, Mary and Joseph took him to the Temple to dedicate him to God. Simeon was in the Temple and as soon as Simeon saw the baby, he knew that Jesus was the Christ and that God had kept the promise that was made. Simeon took the child in his arms and praised God, saying, "Lord, now let your servant go in peace. As you have promised, I have seen your salvation, which you have prepared for all people." Anna, a prophetess, was also in the Temple worshiping and praying. She came along just as Simeon was talking to Mary and Joseph. When she heard what Simeon was saying, she began praising God and telling everyone that this child was the Savior that God had promised. How happy they must have been to know that God fulfilled the promises God made to them many years ago!

Loving God, help us to follow your lead by keeping the promises that we make to ourselves and to others. Amen.
