Baptism of Our Lord

Hello friends! Can you help me remember what that big bowl in our church sanctuary is used for? I know, it's been a while since you've seen it. What's in that big bowl? Yes, water! But not just any water, it's the water of new life. Adults and children come to this water, are baptized in the name of the Father, Son, and the Holy Spirit, and marked with the cross of Christ, claimed forever as God's own beloved child.

Jesus was baptized in the Jordan River by his cousin, John, the Baptist. Our gospel lesson from Mark tells us that right after Jesus was baptized, he came up out of the water and the sky opened up and the Spirit of God came down upon him like a beautiful dove. From that time on, Jesus was filled with God's powerful Spirit and he did amazing things. Did you know that the same thing happened to you when you were baptized? You, too, have the power of God's Spirit. The very same Spirit that Jesus used to heal people is in you! The God of love is in your heart and hands, even your tiny ones. Have you ever helped someone to feel better by hugging them or telling someone you love them? That is the power of God's love that shines in you. Can you name some other ways that we can share love and help heal the world?

Loving God, you have named us and claimed us as your own beloved children. Each day as we wash our face, let us remember our baptism. Help us to use your Spirit to heal the world. Amen.
