## July 13-15, 2023

### Roanoke College, Salem

Then Jesus said to [Zaccheus], "Today salvation has come to this house ... for the Son of Man came to seek out and to save the lost."  
(Luke 19.9-10 NRSV)



In the gospels, Jesus draws crowds wherever he goes. People who would otherwise have nothing to do with each other are drawn together in the practice of seeking him. We will look at a vision of the church that has this kind of seeking at its center. Come and explore the theme of Seeking and Finding as it appears in Scripture and in our own journeys of faith. Together we will see how our seeking Jesus (and his seeking us) is the common ground we need to love one another across all the issues and life experiences that threaten to divide us.

Inviting us into this seeking of and with Jesus is the **Rev. Dr. Mary Hinkle Shore**, keynote presenter and former Rector and Dean of Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary of Lenoir-Rhyne University. Dr. Shore has also served as a professor of New

Testament for sixteen years at Luther Seminary in St. Paul, MN. An ordained minister, Dr. Shore has served pastorates in North Dakota and North Carolina. She is the author of *Signs of Belonging: Luther's Marks of the Church and the Christian Life* and numerous articles and essays. She lives in Brevard, North Carolina, with her husband, Hank, a joyful Corgi, and an old but spry tabby cat.

We are also pleased to welcome the **Rev. Dr. Steven S. Tuell**, an ordained elder in the United Methodist Church, and the James A. Kelso Professor Emeritus of Hebrew and Old Testament at Pittsburgh Theological Seminary. His current work in progress is a book on creation in Scripture for Westminster John Knox. After studying at West Virginia Wesleyan College and Princeton Theological Seminary, he earned his doctorate in Hebrew Bible at Union Theological Seminary in Virginia, and taught at Erskine College, SC (1989-1992), Randolph-Macon College, VA (1992- 2005), and Pittsburgh Theological Seminary, PA (2005-2021). An ordained elder in the United Methodist Church, Tuell has pastored churches in Pennsylvania, New Jersey, West Virginia, and Virginia. In retirement, he continues to preach and teach Scripture in a variety of settings. Tuell has written numerous books and articles on the Hebrew Bible, and with his co-authors Stephen Cook and John Strong recently completed *The Prophets: Introducing Israel's Prophetic Literature* with Fortress Press (2022). His current work in progress is a book on creation in Scripture for Westminster John Knox. Tuell blogs as "The Bible Guy" at [www.steventuell.net](http://www.steventuell.net). He and his wife Wendy have three adult sons.

Our Minnick Educational Staff help students ages 5 to 22 who have experienced challenges in public schools reach their academic, behavioral, vocational, and developmental goals. Minnick Schools, licensed by the Virginia Department of Education as private day schools, serve students in the Harrisonburg, Roanoke, Wytheville, Wise, and Bristol regions.

Highly trained educators and treatment specialists help 200+ students learn about behavior choices, how to make better decisions, and how to respond to stressful and challenging situations, alongside a vibrant academic program meeting the requirements and expectations of more than school districts. Minnick Schools offer social skills groups and individualized behavioral supports to students with emotional and learning disabilities. Our educational staff support them so they can return successfully to their home public schools or make the transition to life after graduation.

## Concurrent Sessions A: Friday, July 14, 10:30-11:45AM



### **A1 Who ARE those Guys? The (Not So) Minor Prophets (Offered Twice)**

**The Rev. Dr. Steven Tuell, Bible Study Leader**

The twelve short books at the end of our Old Testament (commonly called the "Minor" Prophets) have indeed played a minor role in much Christian teaching and preaching. But these books have much to tell us that is particularly relevant to our current circumstances.



### **A2 Building the Kingdom of God through Public Policy**

**Sheila Herlihy Hennessee, Faith Organizer for Virginia Interfaith Center for Public Policy**

The work of justice is hard to wrap our brains around (and for both individuals and our churches), but it is essential to building a society more like God envisions. Join VICPP Faith Organizer, Sheila Herlihy Hennessee, to talk about the difference between justice and charity, the importance of working together, and how you and your congregation can get involved!



### **A3 Oyster Shell Angels Craft**

### **A4 Truth in Love: Conflict Management for Congregations through the Lens of God's Love** **The Rev. Liz Radtke, Truth in Love Coordinator, Virginia Synod**

We are all created in the image of God, and when we look at one another we are looking into the face of God. When we are in conflict with another person, it's sometimes hard to look at them and see the face of God. We can easily reduce another to a tag line, a position, or an opponent, and forget to see the image-bearer in front of us. In this workshop we will take the time to learn how to healthily navigate conflict while honoring God's presence in others.



### **A5 The Development of Religious Freedom in Virginia, 1600-2000**

A discussion of religious freedom in Virginia from 1600 to 2000 and the people who made it a reality. What is religious freedom as explained by Thomas Jefferson, George Wythe and George Mason. How did it evolve from no religious freedom, through a period of tolerance for some, to a legal action that guaranteed for all citizens of the state of Virginia.

### **B1 “And Strangers Now Are Friends”: Seeking and Evangelism**

**The Rev. Dr. Mary Hinkle Shore, Keynote Presenter**



In the hymn, “I Come with Joy,” we sing, “The love that made us, makes us one, and strangers now are friends, and strangers now are friends.” We often describe our congregations and evangelism strategies with the words, “welcoming” and “inviting.” In this workshop, participants will consider the evangelism strategy of a “seeking” congregation. Come and learn specific practices of outreach that characterize the seeking congregation. See how Christian community looks different when we imagine all of us (both “we” members of a congregation and “they” who are outside it) seeking Jesus together.

This workshop will focus on musical stewardship in today's church and how that works hand-in-hand with our weekly worship services. “Training and equipping” has never been more diverse in practice, when the implementation of music in worship has the potential to include choirs as well as praise bands, handbell groups as well as rhythm sections, and solos that originate from oratorios to K-LOVE. The wonderfully multi-generational opportunities to serve are so clearly evident - so how do we get started in fulfilling our congregations' potential in this area? How do we “sing a new song” in today's church, and what can that sound like? And of course, how does this musical work of the people allow us to pray twice? All of this represents an exciting and very present opportunity to renew and enrich our music in worship.

### **B4 Lutheran Perspective on Christian Nationalism (Part 1)**

**The Rev. Jim Cobb, Retired Pastor, First, Norfolk**



Will seek definition and history of this movement and how it's entangled with evangelicalism and how it presents a threat to democracy and core values and how Lutherans can critique such a movement.

### **B5 Biblical Storytelling**

**Kathy Thompson and Judy Wilfong, Muhlenberg, Harrisonburg**



Listen to stories and learn how you can become a Biblical Storyteller. Learn the methods used to tell stories by heart and how to use Biblical Storytelling in your own congregation.

### **C1 Look at the History of Black Lutheranism**

**Sylvia Eley, St. Timothy, Norfolk**

In the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, the whitest denomination in the US (96% white), black Lutheranism is a little-known part of its history. The church's recognition of Black history should not be based on obligation but out of our love for humanity. Loving our fellow man includes learning about them. Just as Jesus loves us, we should love all of humanity. God wants us to value diversity. Black History is all our history. Come learn about Blacks who's sacrifices and faith helped shape Lutheranism and see how the past meets the present.



### **C2 Seeking and Finding in Short Story Literature**

**The Rev. Robert McCarty, Christ, Staunton**

The arts, including literature, offer various reflections that affirm the Christian gospel message of hope for lost and wandering souls. Artists depict Biblical moments in the settings and clothing of their period to help make the meaning local. Writers can re-imagine the Biblical stories in new and inventive ways to expand the meaning and insight. This workshop will highlight examples from familiar secular authors. For those who wish to read ahead, we will discuss Oscar Wilde's "The Selfish Giant" and Leo Tolstoy's "Papa Panov's Christmas."



### **C3 What Do You Practice?**

**Maribeth Ocock, St. Mark, Yorktown**

Joy . . Anger . . Worry . . Kindness . . Love . . Judgment. We will explore all the ways we can practice our life choices with more positivity ownership. A fun and low key workshop to help us all be very good with what we practice!!!



### **C4 Early Church in Virginia**

**Trenton Hizer, Christ, Richmond**

We will be exploring Virginia's religious history from the founding at Jamestown in 1607 to the passage of the Virginia Statute of Religious Freedom in 1786, looking at laws, citizens' petitions, and other documents to see how Virginians expressed their religious views and how those views may have changed over time. We will see how the concept of religious practice and freedom grew and adapted from the colony's earliest laws to George Mason's Declaration of Rights and Thomas Jefferson's statute.
