ASSEMBLY OFFERINGS

Offerings designated to support GraceInside's Chaplains are dedicated to meeting the spiritual needs of all residents of Virginia's state prisons. Chaplains provide one-on-one pastoral care, conduct worship services and work with the Department of Corrections staff in offering rehabilitative programs. Chaplains are also responsible for scheduling all religious programs conducted by volunteers representing many faith traditions. This year GraceInside Chaplains will serve approximately 24,000 imprisoned men and women in Virginia's state correctional facilities.

FEE SCHEDULE

This year's Assembly registration fees reflect the unique experience of a digital Assembly. Lay Voting Members and Rostered Ministers Under Call: \$65.00. REGISTRATION

Registration is online. To <u>register</u>, <u>click here</u>, you will need a debit or credit card to process the registration fees. (Remember to submit the <u>lay voting member credential form</u>).

LAY VOTING MEMBER CREDENTIAL FORM

Each congregation of this synod with 400 or less baptized members are entitled to two lay voting members at assembly, normally one a man and one a woman. For each additional 200 baptized members, the congregation is entitled to an additional voting member. All congregations should certify their lay voting members using a voting member credential form. Congregations are encouraged to turn in this form by March 28, 2024. The cut-off time for lay voting member credential forms is 10 days (April 17, 2024) before the first day of the assembly. If the credential form is not received in the Synod Office by April 17, the layperson will not be able to vote (per the Virginia Synod Constitution (\$7.21.03.).

VISITORS

Churchwide Assembly: July 28-August 2, 2025, in Phoenix, Arizona

The ELCA Churchwide Assembly, the primary decision-making body of the church, is a process of communal spiritual discernment that happens every three years. This event is invitation-only but is always available via live stream for the general public.

What is the Churchwide Council?

The Church Council of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America is both the board of directors of a Minnesota nonprofit corporation and the interim legislative authority of the churchwide organization, one of the three "expressions" of a denomination with deep roots in the U.S. In fulfilling its dual constitutional roles, the Church Council exercises fiduciary, strategic, and generative responsibilities to govern the ELCA churchwide organization. What is the Consultation Committee?

The Virginia Synod Consultation Committee assists the bishop in efforts to resolve a situation - involving rostered ministers - in which there are indications that a cause for discipline may exist and before charges are made. The Consultation Committee is described by the ELCA Constitution and Bylaws in 20.22.04.

What is the Virginia Synod Council?

The Synod Council serves a visionary role in the Virginia Synod. In conjunction with the Office of the Bishop, the Council reviews and coordinates all planning proposals and establishes synod priorities. The members of Synod share their various gifts for the purposes of God's mission and ministry through the Virginia Synod and through the churchwide organization of the ELCA.

The Virginia Synod Council also serves as the board of directors of the Virginia Synod and meets quarterly to supervise the administration of the Synod. These leaders are elected by the Synod Assembly. The Synod Council is composed of members of congregations from across the Virginia Synod, including both rostered ministers (pastors and deacons) and laypeople (those not ordained).

SYNOD ASSEMBLY FORMS

LAY VOTING CREDENTIAL FORM (see description and information above)

<u>RESOLUTION AND MEMORIAL FORM</u> - used to propose a resolution or memorial to the Virginia Synod Assembly, which will be voted on at the Synod Assembly. The Synod Constitution states all resolution requests must be submitted thirty days (March 28) before the first day of the assembly.

NOMINATION FORM - used to nominate oneself or another individual for an elected position at the upcoming Synod Assembly. This form is due by <u>March 28, 2024</u>

<u>AT-LARGE VOTING MEMBER REQUEST FORM</u> - used to submit names of youth/young adults and of persons of color and/or whose primary language is other than English, who can be appointed by Synod Council as lay voting members of the Assembly. This form is due by <u>March 28, 2024</u>.

<u>CONGREGATION SIGNIFICANT EVENTS FORM</u> - are used to share any significant milestones or events from your congregation to be celebrated during the Synod Assembly. This form is due by <u>March 1, 2024</u>.

<u>DIGITAL DISPLAY AREA REQUEST FORM</u> - A designated online display space depicting the many ministries of the synod, its agencies, and institutions will be available. To share information and resources, complete this form by March 28, 2024.
