

What is a disaster?

LDR's definition of disaster:

• An event or circumstance that overwhelms the resources and ability of a community to respond and recover on their own.



Types of Disasters

Conventional

• Natural hazards that might have a negative effect on humans and other animals or the environment, including weather or geological events.


• Unconventional

- May have its origins in a particular incident or be more prolonged.
 Can include an element of human intent, negligence or error.




















LDR's Work Around the World






